Change Is Not A Sign Of Weakness

Change is a challenging concept for me. It often feels like admitting defeat or validating someone else's perspective. However, I've come to realize that change is essential for my growth and recovery as a parent of a child who struggles with addiction. In my journey, I've struggled with the need to control every aspect of my child's life. My program has taught me that "control is an illusion." The only path forward is letting go of harmful behaviors and embracing change.

Change isn't easy, but it's necessary for my well-being and the ability to love my addict. Seeking serenity is crucial for me to change my reactions in difficult times, some days are harder than others. Through my experience, I've learned that change allows me to:

- Let go of toxic patterns and behaviors;
- Develop healthier coping skills;
- Improve my relationships, communication and;
- Focus on my own recovery and growth.

Change is not a sign of weakness, but a sign of strength and willingness to adapt. By embracing change, I'm taking care of myself and setting a positive example for my child. I'm working on accepting that change is a process. With each small step, I'm moving closer to serenity and a more peaceful life.

Change

Whether I want it or not, change will happen. I used to fear change. I think of my path to recovery as the winding road in the children's game of Candyland. I would choose a card; it tells me to take five steps forward. I compare these steps to my real life of getting a promotion at work, getting proper sleep, going to my meetings, and getting along with my addicted loved ones.

Then, I would get the dreaded card that reverts me back to the start of the game. Just like in my real life, when I relapse, I feel like I am destroying the progress I have made in my program. As a result of my relapse, I began to skip my meetings, tried to take control of my addicted loved ones, and did not go to work because I was depressed. I thought the steps I was taking backwards were my personal failures.

I have since learned that Nar-Anon suggests that going backwards is as necessary as going forward. Each time that I stepped back, it helped me to gain perspective. I am learning to be patient and accept how things are. I have stopped trying to control outcomes and have turned my expectations over to the care of my Higher Power.

My husband brought me to the rooms of Nar-Anon. Off he went to a rehab while I stayed behind. This was one of the bleakest moments in my life, I didn't feel like I wanted to go on. Then someone turned the lights on for me by suggesting I attend a Nar-Anon meeting. At first, my progress seemed slow. I thought that the love from my addict was validation of my identity. His active addiction prevented him from taking care of himself, much less me.

I kept coming back to Nar-Anon. I embraced my program by hosting meetings, writing articles for the newsletter, doing outreach, serving on the convention committee, and speaking at conventions. I strengthened my boundaries. I stopped missing work and got a promotion, filed for divorce, and now I am involved in a new and healthy relationship. I moved into a "cute as a button" home with my mom and 16-year-old son. With all these changes, I can now say, I am happy with my life.

Sometimes, the hardest part of change is that it can simultaneously be full of sorrow and joy. As part of my journey, I found my Nar-Anon Group. They are my chosen family. I love them more than I could ever put into words. I have discovered a resilience and strength I didn't know I had. The changes in me are ongoing as I continue to work my program. Change can be painful. I have faith there's a better way to live. This is why I keep coming back!

Page 9-1, Although it is appropriate to ensure funds are available to carry out the normal tasks of groups, areas and regions, these entities should avoid the accumulation of funds in excess of their immediate needs (prudent reserve). Excess funds should be contributed to WSO for the benefit of Nar-Anon as a whole. Our speakers were amazing! The first three speakers spoke on our convention theme: The past is done, the future unknown, live in the moment. They spoke about their triumphs and challenges as double-winners, meaning they currently work a Nar-Anon program alongside another twelve-step program. Our speakers were dynamic, bravely honest, and vulnerable. Their stories brought experience, strength, and hope to us all.

WSC 2025, "Service without Borders," Delegate Report by Linda T., delegate and Linda H., alt delegate.

The 2025 World Service Conference (WSC) "Service without Borders" was the largest conference in our Nar-Anon history. We had 51 Regions that represented16 different countries as well as over almost 200 observers from our fellowship who logged in to observe this 4-day event. The delegates discussed and resolved all 35 motions from the Conference Agenda Report (CAR).

Summary of motions:

22 motions passed, 5 failed, 7 motions were withdrawn by the motion maker, (We withdrew our motion regarding the removal of tie breakers on the last day of the conference. We will address this again at the next conference). 1 motion was ruled out of order, and 3 motions were referred to the Policy & Guidelines (P&G) Committee.

Results:

- We have several pieces of new literature including adding Traditions 5 and 6 to our NFG 36 Workbook, several new interactive outreach posters, and a new outreach letter to professionals. We have a new Narateen Safety Policy & Guidelines, plus several more pieces of literature for Narateen and there is a new Outreach 'Service Learning' PowerPoint available to members.
- We have one new World Service Board (WSB) member.
- The Literature Priority List was completed and will be posted on <u>www.nar-anon.org</u> in the coming weeks. It will be printed in the World Service Serenity Connection Newsletter. Please consider submitting writings to our World Service Literature committee at <u>litcom@nar-anon.org</u>.
- We discussed only one Common Welfare Topic (CWT), "Service". We ran short on time and did not discuss CWT of "Growth". The Western Region Committee (WRC) is planning a Roundtable to discuss 'Growth' on August 9, 2025. All members are encouraged and welcome to attend. Please join us.
